On March 20, 2000, the Juvenile Court granted 20 a blanket order for such release of abducted children's names and photographs. The order expired 21 22 on January 1, 2002. 23 Upon consideration of FTC's March 11, 2002 request for renewal of the expired blanket order, and 24 upon review of the March 28, 2002 response from Kenneth P. Sherman of the Law Offices of 25 Kenneth P. Sherman, the April 4, 2002 response from Judith H. Bayer of County Counsel, and the 26 April 4, 2002 reply from Karen Strickland of FTC, the Juvenile Court hereby finds good cause to 27 renew the blanket order for release of abducted children's names and photographs to FTC, any law 28

enforcement agency and/or appropriate news media, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. DCFS personnel is authorized to release the abducted children's names and photographs to Find the Children, any law enforcement agency and/or appropriate news media for the sole purpose of obtaining information that may lead to the return of the children. This information shall not be used for any other purpose.
- 2. No other information regarding the abducted child's dependency case may be publicly released for any other purpose without further order of the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court.
- 3. At least two court days prior to the release of an abducted child's name and photograph,

  DCFS shall notify the appropriate child's counsel by facsimile and the non-abducting parent

  (at last known address) of its intention to release this information.
- 4. If DCFS demonstrates to the Court and contemporaneously notices the appropriate child's counsel that exigent circumstances exist, the two-day notice shall not be required.

This order shall remain in effect unless it is revoked or otherwise amended on the motion of the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court or at the request of any interested parties.
