QUICK REFERENCE DISSOLUTION JUDGMENT CHECKLIST

If there are minor children of the marriage the following are also needed:

- Declaration Under Uniform Child Custody and Jurisdiction Act (UCCJEA) (FL-105) MUST already be on file
- Child Custody and Visitation Order Attachment (FL-341) (attach to Judgment) **OR** other proposed written order containing the information required by Family Code section 3048(a)
- Stipulation to Establish or Modify Child Support Order and Order (FL-350) attached to the Judgment, **OR** acknowledgment under Family Code section 4065 included in written agreement, **OR** Child Support Information and Order Attachment (FL-342) attached to the Judgment
- Notice of Rights and Responsibilities (Health-Care Costs and Reimbursements Procedures) and Information Sheet on Changing a Child Support Order (FL-192) (may be attached by the party or by the Court)
