

THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of substantial civil unrest threatening the orderly operation of the courts in Los Angeles County (and resulting in substantial operational impediments), and the proclamation of a state of emergency by Governor Newsom as a result of the civil unrest, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles. Upon the request of Presiding Judge Kevin C. Brazile, it is ordered that the Superior Court of Los Angeles County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that from June 1, 2020, to June 5, 2020, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, if the above-described emergency conditions prevent the court from conducting necessary proceedings on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination by five (5) additional court days in cases that have deadlines that already were extended from 10 court days to 30 court days under the March 30, 2020, statewide order, and which will have their extended deadlines expire between June 1, 2020, and June 5, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9), (b); Statewide Emergency Order (03-30-20); Executive Order N-38-20 (03-27-20)).
