PERSONAL INJURY CASE RECORDS NOW MAINTAINED IN ELECTRONIC FORMAT

Effective Feb. 1, 2018, court files for cases assigned to the Personal Injury Courts at the Stanley Mosk Courthouse will no longer be maintained in a paper format. All records for these cases will be recorded and stored in an electronic format (Government Code § 68150).

The paperless record storage system does not apply to personal injury cases filed at LASC's North District Personal Injury Hub Courts, which will continue to maintain paper court files.

Electronic files may be viewed without cost on any of the public access computers located in Los Angeles Superior Court courthouses, or for a nominal fee from the Court's website, LACourt.org. Requests for paper copies of filed documents can also be obtained via the public access computers or at LACourt.org.

This new process will provide increased efficiencies for court staff and the public, and will also enhance the Court's ability to maintain complete and accessible court records.
