Amended General Order Re: General Jurisdiction Personal Injury Cases – Filing Location

Pursuant to the authority set forth in Rule 10.603 of the California Rules of Court, and as authorized by resolutions of the Los Angeles Superior Court Executive Committee on March 21, 2012, and on February 20, 2013, acting pursuant to Local Rule 1.7(a), it is hereby ordered as follows:

Effective March 18, 2013, any Local Rule inconsistent with the matters set forth below is suspended.

Effective March 1, 2014, all Los Angeles Superior Court personal injury cases in General Jurisdiction must be filed in the Stanley Mosk Courthouse, located at 111 N. Hill Street, Los Angeles 90012, or the Michael Antonovich Antelope Valley Courthouse, located at 42011 4th Street West, Lancaster 93534, according to the Filing Court Locator.

Personal injury cases are defined as:

“An unlimited civil action described on the Civil Case Cover Sheet Addendum and Statement of Location (LACIV 109) as Motor Vehicle – Personal Injury/Property Damage/Wrongful Death; Personal Injury/Property Damage/Wrongful Death – Uninsured Motorist; Product Liability (not asbestos or toxic/environmental); Medical Malpractice – Physicians & Surgeons; Other Professional Health Care Malpractice; Premises Liability; Intentional Bodily Injury/Property Damage/Wrongful Death; or Other Personal Injury/Property Damage/Wrongful Death. Actions for intentional infliction of emotional distress, defamation, civil rights/discrimination and malpractice other than medical malpractice are not included in this definition. Actions for injury to real property are not included in this definition.”
