ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR THE REAFFIRMATION OF APPOINTMENT OR RE-APPOINTMENT AND/OR REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF HUMANE OFFICERS [Corp. Code, §14502 et seq.]

TO: ALL CORPORATIONS OR SOCIETIES CREATED FOR THE PURPOSE OF PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, who seek appointment or reappointment of humane officers from the Los Angeles Superior Court pursuant to California Corporations Code section 14502 et seq.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in order to provide the Los Angeles Superior Court with a suitable record and factual basis for appointing and/or re-appointing humane officers pursuant to Corporations Code section 14502 et seq., and pursuant to the authority of the Presiding Judge of the Court as set forth in California Rules of Court, rule 6.603, as well as the authority of all judges as set forth in Code of Civil Procedure section 128, the Los Angeles Superior Court hereby adopts the procedures and policies set forth herein for appointing and/or re-appointing humane officers whose appointments/re-appointments have been recommended by a humane society created under Corporations Code section 10400 et seq.

ASSIGNMENT OF JURISDICTION: The Supervising Judge of the Criminal Division of the Los Angeles Superior Court or his or her designee is assigned all responsibility for appointing, re-appointing and revoking the appointments of humane officers pursuant to Corporations Code section 14500 et seq., which includes jurisdiction over all appointments of humane officers that have heretofore been made, or the renewal thereof.

- 1. REQUIRED FORM AND PROCEDURE FOR FILING OF APPLICATION: All recommendations for appointment and/or reappointment of humane officers pursuant to California Corporations Code section 14502 shall be contained within an application requesting relief that complies with California Rules of Court, rule 2.100 et seq.
- a. Caption: The application shall be captioned "In re Application of: _______, a corporation formed and existing for the prevention of cruelty to animals."
- **b. Pleading Name**: The application shall be named "RECOMMENDATION TO SUPERIOR COURT TO REAFFIRM APPOINTMENT [RE-APPOINTMENT] OF HUMANE OFFICER [Ca Corp. Code, §14502 et seq.]"
- c. File Location: The application and all papers relating to the application may be filed by mail or in person with the Clerk of Court, Los Angeles Superior Court, Clara Shortridge Foltz Criminal Justice Center, 210 West Temple Street, 2nd Floor, Clerk's Office. If a conformed copy is desired, the Clerk shall be provided a suitable self-addressed envelope with sufficient prepaid postage. The applicant must retain a copy of all filings.
- **d.** Special Proceeding Case Number: At the time of filing, the Administrator shall assign the application a unique Special Proceeding Number, preceded with the letters "HS", and such number shall be placed on the application and on all other matters relating to the application for appointment/re-appointment of a humane officer.
- e. Notice and Service of Application: Prior to the confirmation/reaffirmation of the appointment of a humane officer, a humane society must notify the appropriate law enforcement agencies, including the local police department and the sheriff of the county in which the society is incorporated of the society's intent to enforce laws for the prevention of cruelty to animals.

(1) Sheriff of Los Angeles County, properly addressed to Los Angeles County Sheriff's

- (3) City Attorney of the City of Los Angeles, properly addressed to Los Angeles City Attorney's Office, Chief of the Criminal Division, 500 City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012.
- f. Fingerprint and Background Check Requirements: The California Department of Justice (DOJ) only accepts submission of fingerprints via LiveScan rather than the former method of submitting fingerprint imprints taken on an 8x8 card. It is the applicant's responsibility to submit fingerprints for LiveScan results through a private vendor. The application must be filed within sixty (60) days of the submission of the LiveScan. The submission of fingerprints via LiveScan results in a written report issued by the DOJ regarding the applicant's background which includes the applicant's criminal record, if any. This letter constitutes sufficient evidence to fulfill the mandated background check requirement under Corporations Code sections 14502(c) and 14052(d). It is the applicant's responsibility to confirm the Court's receipt of the DOJ report. In the event that the written report comes to the applicant, it is the applicant's responsibility to file the DOJ's written report with the application for appointment/re-appointment of a humane officer.
- g. Representation to the Superior Court: For each application for the appointment and/or reappointment of a humane officer requested, the body of the pleading shall include a representation from the applicant, supported by the evidence set forth below, concerning the qualifications and fitness of each appointee that is the subject of the application.

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- 2. REQUIRED DECLARATIONS AND EVIDENCE: Each application containing a reques for appointment or reappointment of a humane officer shall have attached thereto a declaration under the penalty of perjury and supported by documentation, establishing each of the following
 - Recommendation by a Corporation: The appointee is recommended for a. appointment [or re-appointment] as a humane officer by a nonprofit corporation created for the prevention of cruelty to animals formed under Corporations Code section 10400. Corp. Code, §§ 14500, 14502(a)(1)(A)(i), 14502(a)(2), 14502(b).
 - (i) Qualified Corporate Status: The applicant is a humane society or society for the prevention of cruelty to animals eligible to apply for an appointment of an individual as a humane officer pursuant to Corporation Code sections 14500 et seq. and 14500 et seq, including evidence establishing:
 - (a) Qualifying Name: That the corporation existed prior to 1997, or does not use or specify a name or style of the same, or substantially the same, as that of any previously existing society or corporation in this state organized for a like purpose. Corp. Code, §§ 14500, 14502(a)(1)(A)(i). (b) Incorporated in Los Angeles County: The applicant humane society is

incorporated in the County of Los Angeles. Corp. Code, § 14502(b).

- b. **Proof of Incorporation**: The humane society recommending appointment of the human officer must submit proof of its incorporation in compliance with Corporation Code section 10400 et seq. Corp. Code. §§14502(b), 14502(b).
- Length of Incorporation: The recommending humane society must submit c. proof that it has been incorporated for six months prior to its recommendation of an appointee as a humane officer. Corp. Code, §14502(a)(2).
- d. **Liability Insurance**: The recommending humane society must submit proof tha it possesses liability insurance policy of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury or property damage. Corp. Code, §14502(a)(2); 14502(b).
- **Resolution by Corporation**: The recommending humane society's board of directors or trustees must appoint a humane officer. Each appointment of a humane

officer must be by separate resolution of the recommending humane society's board of directors or trustees. Corp. Code, §§14502(a)(2), 14502(a)(3). The resolution must include:

- (1) The full name and address of the appointing agency;
- (2) The full name of the person so appointed;
- (3) The fact that he/she is a citizen of the United States and a resident of the State of California; and
- (4) The number of the badge to be allotted to the appointed humane officer. (*Id.*) In addition, the resolution must be certified to be correct by the president and secretary of the society, attested by its seal, duly entered on the minutes and provide a signature line for the bench officer's signature. Corp. Code, §14502(b).

A copy of this resolution meeting these requirements must be filed with the Court Corp. Code, §§ 14502(a)(2), 14502(a)(3), 14502(b). The resolution must be signed within a reasonable time contemporaneous to the filing of the application, such that the resolution is signed no more than six (6) months prior to the filing of the application.

- f. <u>Citizenship</u>: The recommended appointee must be a citizen of California. Corp. Code, section 14502 (a)(2).
- g. Proof of Training: In every application to reaffirm an appointment or reappointment of a humane officer, the recommending humane society must declare, and attach documentation as evidence, that the appointee has satisfactorily completed the applicable training requirements set forth under Corporations Code section 14502(i) (See Corp. Code, §14502(a)(2); §14502(a)(3); §14502(b)) and attest to the appointee's fitness to act as a humane officer. In its declaration, the applicant humane society must also indicate:
 - (1) Whether the appointee is applying to become a Level 1 or Level 2 humane officer;
 - (2) Whether the appointee is applying to the court for appointment or reappointment as a humane officer;

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- (3) Describe how the appointee has fulfilled his/her training requirements;
- (4) Explain how certificates provided as evidence of completion of training meet the specific training requirements described under Corporations Code §14502.
- 3. **EXPIRATION OF APPOINTMENT:** All appointments of humane officers shall automatically expire if the society disbands or legally dissolves. In addition, all appointments automatically expire within three years from the date on which the certified copy of the court order was filed with the county clerk. Corp. Code §14502(f).

4. FILING OF OPPOSITION AND REPLY:

Opposition to the application to reaffirm may be filed by any interested party. All papers filed in opposition to the application to reaffirm and in reply to the opposition must conform to law and motion pleading requirements, pursuant to California Rules of Court Rule 3.1113(d). Any opposition may not exceed 15 pages in length and the reply may not exceed 10 pages in length, excluding exhibits and declarations.

- a. Any opposition must be filed no later than 15 <u>court</u> days after service of the complete application accepted by the court for filing. In instances where a party is not served, opposition must be filed within 15 court days of posting of notice of filing of the application to reaffirm on the court's website.
 - Any opposition must be served on all parties indicated on the Proof of Service attached to the application to reaffirm.
 - Any opposition must be served on the Court in Department 100 of the Clara Shortridge Foltz Justice Center at 210 West Temple Street, Los Angeles California, 90012.
- b. The applicant's reply, if any, to the opposition must be filed 10 <u>court</u> days after service of the opposition.
 - i. The reply must be served on all parties indicated on the Proof of Service attached to the application to reaffirm and to any party not named on the Proof of Service but who has filed an opposition.

The reply must be filed in Department 100 of the Clara Shortridge Foltz
 Justice Center at 210 West Temple Street, Lo Angeles California 90012.

The matter will be deemed submitted for ruling, without a hearing, unless the Court notifies the interested parties of its intention to hold a hearing. In this event, the court clerk will notify the interested parties of the date and time set for the hearing.

5. PROPOSED ORDER:

The application recommending the court reaffirm an appointment (or reappointment) of a humane officer must be accompanied by a proposed order for each appointee, complying with California Rules of Court, rule 2.100 et seq.

The proposed order must be entitled "Order Reaffirming Appointment [or Reappointment] of Humane Officer (Cal. Corp. Code §14502, et seq.)] and should include verbiage similar to the following:

"[Name of Humane Society] having applied to the Superior Court in which it is incorporated to reaffirm its appointment of the following individual as a humane officer pursuant to Corporations Code section 14502, and having provided satisfactory evidence that it is an entity entitled to appoint humane officers pursuant to that section, and that the individual listed herein is qualified and fit to act as a humane officer, the court reaffirms that appointment [or reappointment] and grants the application for a period of three years pursuant to Corp. Code §14502(f).

6. REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF HUMANE OFFICERS

a. Revocation by Corporation That Appointed Humane Officer: The corporation appointing an officer may unilaterally revoke an appointment at any time by filing in the office of the county clerk in which the appointment of the officer is recorded a copy of the revocation

in writing under the letterhead of the corporation and duly certified by its executive officer. Upon the filing, the county clerk shall enter the fact of the revocation and the date of the filing thereof opposite the name of the officer in the record of humane officers. Corp. Code, § 14502 (g)(1).

- **b.** Revocation Initiated by a Law Enforcement Agency or State Humane

 Association of California: A revocation hearing may be initiated by petition from any duly authorized sheriff or local police agency or the State Humane Association of California. The petition shall show cause why an appointment should be revoked and shall be made to the superior court in the jurisdiction of the appointment. Corp. Code § 14502(g)(2).
 - (i) <u>Title</u>: The Petition shall be entitled "Petition for Revocation of Appointment of Humane Officer [name of officer and badge number] (Corp. Code § 14502(g)(2)."
 - (ii) <u>Hearing:</u> Hearing date is obtained by contacting the court clerk in Department 100 of the Clara Shortridge Foltz Criminal Justice Center, Los Angeles Superior Court, Criminal Division.
 - (iii) <u>Service, Filing and Format of Petition</u>: Filing, service and format protocol shall conform to the law and motion requirements under Code of Civil Procedure, California Rules of Court and the California Corporations Code. Corp. Code, §1700.
 - (a) Notice of the hearing date and a copy of the Petition must be served in the same manner as a summons upon the humane officer subject to the Petition and upon the corporation who appointed the officer. (See generally, Code of Civ. Pro., §§ 416.10, 413.10, 417.10, 412.30 [must contain adequate notice to person that he/she is served on behalf of the corporation and/or is being served individually.]) (b) All papers filed in opposition to the Petition and in reply to the opposition must conform to law and motion requirements. (See generally, Code Civ. Pro., §§ 1005, 1010, 1012, 1013a; Cal. Rules of Court, rule 3.1110 et seq.)
 - (iv) Upon a finding of good cause, the court shall issue an order granting the petition revoking the appointment. Corp. Code § 14502(g)(2). The court's revocation order shall immediately be forwarded by the clerk of the court for filing to the office of the county clerk in which the appointment of the officer is recorded. Upon filing the county clerk

shall enter the fact of the revocation and the date of the filing thereof opposite the name of the officer in the record of humane officers.

- (v) The clerk of the court shall give notice of the Court's order to all parties, as well as to all entities named on the service list of this order. (See, *infra*.)
- 7. FILES OPEN TO PUBLIC INSPECTION: All pleadings, orders and papers are to be filed and maintained as a court file open to public inspection, except for any reports received as to the record of the appointee from the Department of Justice, which reports are required by law to be maintained confidentially, and which should be retained in a sealed portion of the file not open or available to the public.
- 8. SEARCH WARRANTS: All search warrants requested by any Humane Society which has been endorsed pursuant to these procedures shall be filed in Los Angeles Superior Court,

 Department 100, 210 W. Temple Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012, to be heard by the Supervising Judge or Assistant Supervising Judge of the Criminal Courts. Additionally, all search warrants

requested by any Humane Society which has been endorsed pursuant to these procedures shall

- contain the name of the humane officer requesting the search warrant, his or her badge number, and his or her date of certification with the Los Angeles Superior Court. Corp. Code §14502(f).
