SPECIAL ORDER RE: THE ALLIANCE FOR CHILDREN'S RIGHTS BLANKET ACCESS ORDER - DEPENDENCY

The ALLIANCE FOR CHILDREN'S RIGHTS, (hereafter "The Alliance"), requests that it be given access to juvenile court records and information on dependent children who have been referred to The Alliance by the Dependency Court or its attorneys for the purpose of representing said dependent children in matters involving, but not limited to, any of the following areas:

Government Benefits; Health Care Services; Probate Guardianships; Regional Center; Special Education; and other matters related to the health and well-being of the child.

GOOI) CAUSE APPEARING, the Juvenile Court hereby issues the following order pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 827 and California Rules of Court, Rule 1423.

1. Where necessary and relevant to properly assess a case, prepare a case or represent a dependent minor who has been referred to The Alliance for representation or legal assistance, The Alliance staff or pro bono attorney representing the minor shall be given access to the minor, to persons connected to the minor, to the juvenile court

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REPRESENTATION," signed under penalty of perjury setting forth said need.

"Records" include, but are not limited to, those defined in California Rules of Court, Rule 1423: (1) all documents filed in a juvenile court case; (2) Reports to the court by probation officers, social workers of child welfare services programs, and court-appointed special advocates; (3) Documents made available to probation officers, social workers of child welfare services, and court-appointed special advocates in preparation of reports to the court; (4) Documents relating to a child concerning whom a petition has been filed in juvenile court, which are maintained in the office files of probation officers, social workers of child welfare services programs, and court-appointed special advocates; (5) Transcripts, records or reports relating to matters prepared or released by the court, probation department or child welfare services program; and (6) Documents, video or audio tapes, photographs and exhibits admitted into evidence at juvenile court hearings; the minor clients juvenile court file and DCS records, as well as educational records, medical records, and psychological records contained therein.

"Information" includes, but is not limited to, information about the minor client, which is otherwise confidential, obtained from the minor client's foster parents, social workers, day care providers or teachers.

"Persons connected to the minor" include, but are not limited to, the minor clients' loster parents, social workers, day care providers or teachers.

- 3. The Alliance staff and pro bono attorneys shall be bound by all laws pertaining to juvenile court confidentiality, as well as Los Angeles Superior Court Local Rules 17.1 and 17.2 regarding confidentiality and media access.
- 4. The Alliance staff and pro bono attorneys shall employ all necessary safeguard measures, including implementation of in-house procedures and protocols regarding storage, sealing and access, to ensure against breach of confidentiality and unauthorized dissemination of any records or information received pursuant to this order.
