## CIVIL DIVISION'S TRANSITION TO ELECTRONIC FILING OF COMPLEX CASES UPDATE

The Los Angeles Superior Court has transitioned to the next phase of providing for mandatory efiling for all limited and unlimited jurisdiction civil cases. Efiling provides efficiencies and enhances the Court's ability to maintain complete and easily accessible records.

**Note: The Court has set a new date for mandatory efiling for complex cases, which is April 1, 2019, as indicated in the charts below.**

### Discontinuation of Fax Filings

As previously announced, direct fax filing will be eliminated upon the implementation of mandatory efiling. See the table below for the dates fax filings will no longer be accepted:

Civil Case Category	Date Fax Filings Will No Longer Be Accepted
Unlimited Civil	January 2, 2019
Complex Civil	<b>April 1, 2019</b>

## **Implementation of Electronic Filing – Mandatory Phase**

**There is only a mandatory phase for efileing Complex Civil documents.** Prior to implementation of this mandatory phase, documents may be presented for filing at the clerk's office or may be submitted via fax filing. Attorneys must efile documents as of the dates marked as mandatory.

The implementation schedule for unlimited and complex civil efileing is as follows:

	<b>Voluntary</b>	<b>Mandatory</b>
<b>Unlimited Civil</b>	<b>December 3, 2018</b>	<b>January 2, 2019</b>
<b>Complex Civil</b>	<b>N/A</b>	<b>April 1, 2019</b>
