PRESIDING JUDGE KEVIN C. BRAZILE EXTENDS CERTAIN DEPENDENCY DEADLINES UNDER NEW GENERAL ORDER

Presiding Judge Kevin C. Brazile today announced that Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye has authorized and granted, under Government Code section 68115, Presiding Judge Kevin C. Brazile's request to extend certain Dependency deadlines due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

Presiding Judge Brazile today issued a General Order to extend:

- The time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending Dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than seven (7) days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline would otherwise expire from November 9, 2020, to December 5, 2020, inclusive; and
- The time period provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending Dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than seven (7) days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline would otherwise expire from November 9, 2020, to December 5, 2020, inclusive.

AMENDED GENERAL ORDER
2020-GEN-023-02

On the same grounds, and for the same reasons as set forth in the General Order filed on October 9, 2020, the Court amends paragraph 5, sub. a and b, in General Order 2020-GEN-023-00 as follows, nunc pro trunc:

THE COURT HEREBY FINDS, AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

5. Juvenile Dependency and Juvenile Delinquency Emergency Order Continuances:

- a. The Court extends the time periods provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than seven (7) days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline would otherwise expire from **November 9, 2020 to December 5, 2020**, inclusive.
- b. The Court extends the time periods provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than seven (7) days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline would otherwise expire from **November 9, 2020 to December 5, 2020**, inclusive.

1 **THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT**
2 **UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, OR UNTIL ITS PROVISIONS EXPIRE BY THEIR TERMS,**
3 **ARE RESCINDED, AMENDED, OR ARE SUPERSEDED BY SUBSEQUENT ORDERS.**
4 **THIS ORDER MAY BE AMENDED AS CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE.**

5 **GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFORE, IT IS SO ORDERED.**
