ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE PRESIDING JUDGE RE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

GENERAL ORDER

Due to the COVID-19 epidemic resulting in Governor Newsom's Declaration of a State of Emergency; the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health declaring a local and public health emergency in response to the increased spread of COVID-19 across the county of Los Angeles; President Donald Trump declaring a national emergency over the outbreak; and the directive from those government officials to ensure and facilitate social distancing, and to protect the health and safety of the public and court personnel, and under the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the March 16, 2020 order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the March 16, 2020 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles,

This court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

1. General Order 4, issued on March 17, 2020, is amended retroactively **to delete** the following subdivisions:

Paragraph 4, subdivision e (Contempt Proceedings in Family Law Where Custody is at Issue).

4. General Order 4, issued on March 17, 2020, is amended retroactively **to add** the following information:

Paragraph 9 now reads: Courthouses providing time-sensitive, essential services will be open beginning on March 20, 2020 at 8:30 a.m. All courthouses will be open beginning on March 20, 2020 at 8:30 a.m., except for Beverly Hills and Catalina. This schedule will be amended as circumstances change.

5. General Order 4, issued on March 17, 2020, is amended retroactively **to add** the following information:

Paragraph 11 now reads: In light of Governor Newsom's Executive Order urging emergency action to promote housing stability and security, the moratoriums on evictions imposed in both the County of Los Angeles and the City of Los Angeles, and the court's inability to hold unlawful detainer related hearings throughout the emergency period, the court finds good cause to continue all unlawful detainer trials without a determination pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 1170.5(c).

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL APRIL 16, 2020 AND MAY BE AMENDED AS CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE.
