12	In its continuing efforts to balance its obligation to maintain access to justice with its		
13	commitment to safeguard the well-being of court users in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, the		
14	SUPERIOR COURT OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS		
15	FOLLOWS:		
16	1. Clerk's Office and Self-Help Center Appointments:		
17	In the interest of safeguarding the well-being of court users, persons seeking services		
18		from the Clerk's Office, court suppo	ort services, and/or the Self-Help Centers are
19	encouraged to schedule appointments. For telephone or video assistance, or to schedule		
20	an appointment, the telephone number for each courthouse is listed at the courthouse		
21	entry and posted on the Court's website, <u>www.lacourt.org</u> .		
22	2.	Face Coverings:	
23		In accordance with General Order 2	021-GEN-023-00, all persons – regardless of
24		vaccination status – are required to	wear face coverings over their nose and mouth while
25		in a courthouse. Persons whose disa	bilities preclude them from wearing face coverings
26		compliant with the Guidance, are un	rged to seek an accommodation under <u>Rule 1.100</u> of
27		the California Rules of Court in adv	ance of their court appearance or appointment.

3. Judicial Emergency Order Continuances:

- a. Juvenile Dependency
 - i. The Court extends the time periods provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than seven (7) days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline would otherwise expire from December 4, 2021 to December 31, 2021, inclusive.
 - ii. The Court extends the time periods provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than seven (7) days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline would otherwise expire from December 4, 2021 to December 31, 2021, inclusive.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, OR UNTIL ITS PROVISIONS EXPIRE BY THEIR TERMS, ARE RESCINDED, AMENDED, OR ARE SUPERSEDED BY SUBSEQUENT ORDERS. THIS ORDER MAY BE AMENDED AS CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE. GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFOR, IT IS SO ORDERED.
