**MANDATORY ELECTRONIC FILING EFFECTIVE MARCH 17 FOR
REPRESENTED PARTIES IN FAMILY LAW CASES WHERE CHILD
SUPPORT IS ENFORCED BY THE CHILD SUPPORT AGENCY**

Beginning March 17, the Court will implement mandatory electronic filing (efiling) for attorneys representing parties in child support cases enforced by the Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) or the Local Child Support Agency (LCSA).

Efiling provides efficiency for litigants and attorneys and enhances the Court's ability to maintain complete and easily accessible records. Registration with an Electronic Filing Service Provider (EFSP) is required to efile. A list of eligible EFSPs is available [here](#).

While no filing fee may be charged to file documents involving matters in which the DCSS or LCSA is providing services relating to child support pursuant to Government Code section 70672, EFSP fees for efilings will apply.

Self-represented litigants are exempt from mandatory efilings; however, self-represented litigants may efile documents through an EFSP or may file documents in person at the clerk's office or by U.S. mail. Additional information regarding efilings is available at www.LACourt.org/efiling.
